And it still continues all over the United States for the Knanaya Catholic Community. The history revealed in this souvenir will help us understand the hurdles along the way.

We gratefully remember and pray for the bishops, priests, and lay ministers who took pain and offered dedicated service for the development of our mission and transforming it to parish. May God help us establish more parishes in Chicago and elsewhere.

l am very glad to know that on the occasion of the first anniversary of the erection of Sacred Heart Knanaya Catholic Parish, Chicago you are bringing out a Souvenir to place on record the long years of the history of its evolution as a parish. Although the mission was established in 1983 with Fr. Jacob Chollambel as the first director, the controversies that rose regarding the membership of non – endogamous Knanites became a serious hindrance in the full flourishing of the mission as a parish. Even after the establishment of the Syro – Malabar Diocese of Chicago, the growth of the Knanaya missions was very much adversely affected by the issue of membership of exogamous Knanities. After long discussions, with the consent of Mar Jacob Angadiyath we could solve the problem by accepting Knanaya parishes which will have its membership exclusively for Knanaya Catholics irrespective of their practice of endogamy. On this condition, with the endorsement of Mar Varkey Vithayathil, the Major Archbishop of the Syro – Malabar Church, who had come to Chicago for the Syro – Malabar Convention, Mar Angadiyath officially recognized the then existing ten Knanaya missions under the Syro- Malabar Diocese. This paved way for the growth of the missions under the efficient leadership of Knanaya Catholic priests sent from Kottayam.

Fr. Abraham Mutholath who took charge of the Knanaya Catholic Mission of Chicago wholeheartedly dedicated himself to the growth and development of the Mission entrusted to him. In spite of his unfailing service in the Hospital, he could bring about great development for the mission. His activities including the regular catechism for children, various pious associations for the faithful, celebration of various events like first communion of children, parish feasts etc added momentum to the growth of the Mission. The need of having a church of their own was seriously felt by the community who stood strong behind his attempts to have the first Knanaya Catholic Church outside India. The long cherished dream of the Community was realized in the form of Scared Heart Knanaya Catholic Parish in September 2006

Now when you are completing one year after the erection of the first Knanaya Catholic Parish outside territorium problem of the Syro – Malabar Church, I congratulate you all most sincerely and request you to work together for the growth of our Community with the zeal and enthusiasm of our fathers who nurtured and protected the early Christian Community in India. May the prayers of our fathers and the blessings of Lord be with you all so that the Knanaya Catholic Community may hold on to its valuable traditions and rich heritage and shine forth as an exemplary model of true Christian Community in the whole of North America. My congratulations and thanks to all our lay people who spend their money, time and energy for this endeavour.

A FEW REMINISCENCES

landed in Chicago on 25-05-1995 with a religious visa for three years to work as the Director of the Knanaya Catholic Mission under the Archdiocese of Chicago. Fr. Cyriac Manthuruthil my Kerala gave me a warm welcome at the airport. Then i was taken by my cousin Simon and family to their house for stay until I get a room in any of the rectories. I stayed with them comfortably and happily for there weeks and meanwhile nobody took interest to find out a room in any rectory. But my old friend from Chunkom parish took me to Fr. Jim the pastor of I.H.M Church where our people gathered for Sunday Mass. Heaising my sad condition Fr. Jim heartily welcomed me to his residence and gave a good room for stay. It was the greatest blessing of God that I got free food and lodge there since I was able to serve without traveling from another place like my predecessor.

I remember with joy and satisfation the services I rendered to our people during my period in Chicago. My first attempt was to form a good church Choir. My old friend Erick Pottor extended his voluntary service to play the organ and under the able guidence of Johny Thekeparampil, a good choir was formed and thus Sunday Mass become very lively and attractive.

My next step was to prepare the kids for first communion. I myself taught them the fundamentals of faith and necessary prayers in English every Sunday on hour before the Mass at I.H.M Church. In order to avoid individual celebrations on the day first communion, I suggested a common dinner for all the members of the Mission at white Eagle Banquet Hall and it was warmly accepted by all. It was appreciated even by non Knanaya People and I think this custom still prevails there.

Christmas and Easter were celebrated with Mass, dinner and cultural programmes in more convenient school hall. It was a time of great rejoicing and fellowship.

Our Knanaya people celebrated Christmas and passover feast in Detroit every year on con-



venient days and I was invited as the main celebration in these functions.

I started to say English Mass for our youth on certain occasions.

Every Good Friday, poeple were taken to the famous pilgrim centers in Indiana and St. Louis by special buses.

Many of our people are devoted to St. Jude and were going to a far off Church to attend the Novena. To give them easy access to this devotion. I started Novena of St. Jude in the Chapel of the Community Hall of K.C.S on every Thursday. When the number of participants increased, the service was shifted to the hall so as to accommodate every one comfortably.

On the occasion of the Episcopal consectation of Bishop Moolakatt we sent to him a good amount of money to build 25 houses in Malabar as memorial of his consecration. In various occasions we could send financial assistance to parishes to build up new Churches.

It was the felt need of our people to own a Church exculsively for them. So I met Bishop Gedet the vicar general of the Arch diocese of Chicago with the request to give us a Church which is closed due to financial strains. He readily replied that about forty Churches remained closed in the South and I can select any on of them at nominal price. But when I disclosed this idea to our people the majority discarded it since the South is notorious for crimes and insecurity. They desired to buy a piece of land in a peaceful area and a to build a new Church there. But it was not practical due to back of fund. Now I am happy to not that the Knanaya faithful in Chicago have a Church of their own and really it is a great mile stone in the history of our people there. I wish all God's blessing to this parish and pray tha it pave the way to further progress in spiritual and meterial realms.

It was a historical fact that the Syro Malabar litugy was first introduced in Chicago by the Diocese of Kottayam sending Fr. Jacob Chollampel as Chaplain of all Syro Malabar faithfull both Knanaya and non Knanaya. But not every late, non Knanaya priest took charge of non Knanaya people and both Syro Malabar missions co-existed. Likewise the Knanaya faithful were in front for the creation fo Syro Malabar diocese in America. I remember that some of the eminent Syro Malabar priests working in America and many prominent lay men living in various states in USA fought and mail against this new venture of Syro Malabar Church and they published many articles expressing their opposition on both Enflish and Malayalam periodicals. Refuting their arguments, fear and anxiety, I publised a long article in Kerala Express and it was well appreciated by all sinsible people. In spite of objections and oppositions against the creation of a Syro Malabar Diocese in America, It has become a reality now and those who desired and worked for it are a happy and proud of it.

I wish every success to the new diocese and the Knanaya parishes within it.

As of November 1, 1991, in the interest of promoting mutual cooperation, understanding, appreciation and order the People of the Syro Malabar Rite and Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish have reached the following agreement:

- 1. Arrangements for the use of parish facilities (Church or Social Center) will be made through Fr. Cyriac Manthuruthil. In turn, he will finalize arrangements with Fr. Novert Zawistanowicz.
- 2. In the interest of helping meet financial expenses the following offering will be made:

\$75.00 for the use of the Church \$100.00 for the use of the Social Center.

- 3. Persons using the facilities will be responsible for clean-up, check-up and the security of the facility. A check-off sheet is available at the rectory.
- 4. When children are present care should be given to monitor their behavior. E.G. there have been occasions when all the votive lights were turned on of a Saturday night. As a result, our people were unable to use them.

Dear Staff of Our Lady of Victory

Many of you know our resident Fr. Abraham Mutholathu Jacob is the one who designed and maintains our parish web site, and also is a full time chaplain at Our Lady of Resurrection Hospital. However what is little known about him is that he is the Vicar General for the Syro Malabar Catholic Diocese of Chicago. For those of you who are unfamiliar with the Syro Malabar Rite, they are one of the over twenty rites of the Catholic Church. This centuries old rite began in the country of India, and as tradition states, evolved from the early Christian community founded by St. Thomas the Apostle.

About a couple of weeks ago, Fr. Abraham had approached me about the Syro Malabar Rite community of possibility using the Our Lady of Victory's facilities on a regular (meaning weekly) basis. For their Sunday masses, they have approximately 250 people and the number of people in religious education is at around 150. Specifically, he wants to use the church for Sunday late afternoon masses, ten classrooms for their religious education, and the use of some of the other locations for special occasions. Since they are an outside group, their presence would bring into question the possibility of potential scheduling conflicts with other parish groups. Fr. Abraham said they are looking at Sundays late afternoon/early evenings, 4-5pm for catechetical sessions in the school for K-8th, first Sundays 3-5pm for high school, second Sundays 2-5pm for adults, and for the church 5:30pm for masses.

While there will be the regular times for their masses and catechetical sessions, there will be some other times (e.g. particular feast days and holidays and the like) in which they will be present outside of the regular times. In his written proposal, he did say that his group will always reserve those dates well enough in advance and will keep the dates flexible so they will not conflict with parish activities. Since most Sunday afternoons the facilities are not used much at OLV, also we have the luxury of having a lower chapel, and the Syro Malabar community is willing to work around our schedules, there should not be many conflicts with other parish groups at OLV.

Basically, this community is looking for a place for worship and catechesis. They will be responsible for the cleaning and maintenance of the facilities used. In terms of opening rooms and locking them, Fr. Abraham has a set of keys since he does live here. However if they need access to rooms which require keys that Fr. Abraham does not have, they will pick them up at the rectory and sign them out just like every other group.

After Fr. Abraham consulted with the other priests and the principal of our school, and has given me written proposal, I have decided that the Syro Malabar community is welcome to use our facilities when they need. If there are any questions or concerns, please bring them up to me and/or Fr. Abraham.

Suggestion to solve the current dispute on the purchase of a church for Knanaya Catholic Mission - Chicago.

Your Excellency Mar Angadiath, Your Grace Mar Moolakkatt, and Your Grace Mar Kunnacherry,

I am presenting here an analysis of the current situation in the mission and my suggestion for solving the issue.

Almost 20% of our community members in the mission are against purchasing any church by the mission. Around 10% of others are against purchasing St. James Church in Maywood only because of security concerns. Another 30% are strongly in favour of purchasing St. James Church in Maywood because if we do not buy this church we will never have another church. The rest of the people (40%) are neutral and will favor any decision.

Here is my suggestion: We shall buy the St. James Church in Maywood and move the Holy Mass and Religious Education School in Addison to Maywood at the convenience of the people. We shall continue the Holy Mass and religious education school at OLV Church in Chicago to take care of the pastoral needs of those who have issues to come to Maywood. This will satisfy the concerns of all involved including Bishop Paprocki. The only possible obstacle to this solution is that the 20% of those who do not want a church at all might object.

Hope you will consider this suggestion favorably. Expecting your blessings.

DECREE

Having heard the discussion of the Presbyteral Council on May 16, 2006 in accord with canon 515 82, and having reflected upon the matter in light of the personnel and resources of the Archdiocese of Chicago, I have decided that St. James Parish in Maywood ought to be divided in accord with canon 122, so that part of the parish will become part of St. Eulalia Parish in Maywood, with the remaining part being joined to St. Simeon Parish in Bellwood. The date of this division should be September 1, 2006.

The pastoral care of the people of St. James Parish will be entrusted to the pastors of St. Eulalia and St. Simeon Parishes.

The parish buildings shall be sold to the Knanaya Catholic Community of the "Syro-Malabar Catholic Diocese of Chicago", with the proceeds from the sale of its assets assigned equally to St. Eulalia Parish and St. Simeon Parish, after all existing debts and other obligations have been satisfied. Any other ecclesiastical good of St. James Parish, such as sacred vessels and vestments, shall become part of the public juridic persons of St. Eulalia and/or St. Simeon Parishes, as designated by the Parochial Administrator of St. James Parish, subject to the approval of the Episcopal Vicar of Vicariate IV.

The boundaries of neighboring parishes shall be altered as follows on the attached sheets.

The proper documents should be drawn up by the Office for Canonical Services.

Dear Cardinal George and Members of the Presbyteral Council:

As Episcopal Vicar for the region of the Archdiocese that includes Maywood, Bellwood and Broadview, I am writing to propose a reconfiguration of our Catholic presence in these areas. Originally built to serve heavily Catholic communities, all three parishes are struggling in these predominantly African-American areas. Many worshippers commute from distant areas. A discussion of ministry in the area began in September, 2004 and has continued at the deanery, pastoral and parish levels (see summary, Appendix A).

As requested by the Presbyteral Council at its March meeting, both St. Eulalia and St. James Parishes have submitted Pastoral Plans to provide for the pastoral care of Maywood and Broadview. As might be expected, each parish describes how it would better serve the community with the other parish coming to its location (see Appendices B and C).

In light of present pastoral needs and projected future trends, it makes sense for the Archdiocese of Chicago to have one parish in Bellwood and one in Maywood. As of January 1, 2006, Reverend Herbert Meyr retired as Pastor of St. James; he continues to serve as Parochial Administrator pending the outcome of plans for the parish. Given the demographic reality of the area and the lack of priests skilled in Hispanic ministry, the spiritual needs of the parish community of St. James can be provided by the neighboring parishes of St. Simeon and St. Eulalia.

St Simeon Parish in Bellwood already has Spanish ministry assisted by the Scalabrinian Fathers in Melrose Park and is best situated to care for the Latinos of St. James Parish, the majority of whom live to the west and north of Maywood (see Appendix D). The location of St. Eulalia Parish just south of the Eisenhower Expressway (I-290) makes it suitable to provide for the communities for south Maywood and Broadview.

While Father Frank Latzko, Pastor of St. Eulalia Parish, has expressed an interest in studying the Spanish language and Latino culture, he is not yet ready to begin offering pastoral services in Spanish. On the other hand, Father Meyr has indicated that, if St. James closes, he would prefer to live in retirement as a Resident at St. Simeon Parish. The Pastor, Father John Mc Carville, is open to this. Father Meyr wishes to remain active in ministry and would help the Latinos make the transition from St. James to St. Simeon.

Another factor for consideration in this plan is the offer of the Syro-Malabar Knanaya Catholic Community to purchase the church, school and rectory at St. James Parish for



\$975,000, which is within estimates of the professional appraisal indicating a fair market value of \$250,000 for the rectory and a range between \$705,000 and \$1,200,000 for the church with attached classroom wings. This Eastern Catholic community of immigrants from India currently worships at Our Lady of Victory Church in Chicago and St. Joseph Church in Addison, IL. They have already raised \$400,000 and are prepared to obtain financing to pay the full amount on the day of purchase (see Appendix E).

Accordingly, as Episcopal Vicar of Vicariate IV, I am requesting a canonical consultation (canon 515, 52) at the Presbyteral Council meeting on May 16, 2006, to consider the division (canon 122) of St. James Parish, with the proceeds from the sale of its assets assigned equally to St. Eulalia Parish and St. Simeon Parish, after its existing debts and other obligations have been satisfied.

I recognize that this plan will be most difficult for the people of St. James Parish. Any plan for the reconfiguration of parishes involves emotional consideration. However, after considering various scenarios, in my opinion this proposal offers the best option in terms of geographic location and pastoral considerations to provide for the future Catholic presence in Maywood, Bellwood and Broadview. It should be noted that this plan also includes an ongoing Catholic presence at St. James Church, but its jurisdiction would transfer from the Latin Rite Archdiocese of Chicago to the Eastern-Rite "Syro-Malabar Catholic Diocese of Chicago." As such, Latin-Rite Catholics can participate in the Syro-Malabar liturgy and receive Holy Communication in that rite (canon 923). Moreover, since he has biritual faculties, the Director of the Syro-Malabar Knanaya Catholic Mission could continue to offer both Latin-Rite and Eastern Rite liturgies, as he currently does at Our Lady of Victory Parish.

If this proposal is approved, I will ask the Pastors involved, the Dean, the Director of Hispanic Ministry, the Office of Research and Planning and the Vicariate Administrative Consultant to work jointly with the Parish and Finance Councils of the respective parishes to facilitate this reconfiguration of parishes.

Thank you for your consideration of this matter.

STATEMENT REGARDING PARISH REORGANIZATION IN THE VILLAGE OF BELLWOOD, MAYWOOD AND BROADVIEW

June 28, 2006

For the past two years, officials of the Archdiocese of Chicago have consulted with pastors and parishioners of the parishes currently serving the communities of Bellwood, Maywood and part of Broadview about existing physical, financial and ministerial resources. These parishes are: St. Simeon in Bellwood, St. James in Maywood, and St. Eulalia in Maywood, whose territory also includes the portion of Broadview north of the I.C.G Railroad tracks. The realities are that the Archdiocese had fewer priests available to be pastors, especially for services in Spanish, and the present congregations are too small to be able to sustain vital programming and to adequately maintain their physical plants in three separate parishes.

As the Episcopal Vicar for the geographical area that includes these communities in the western suburbs of Cook Country, Bishop Thomas Paprocki has been closely involved with the pastors and area residents in the difficult but creative process of developing a vision for the future to provide a viable and strong Catholic presence in this area for years to come.

This planning process resulted in several scenarios designed to create and sustain a strong Catholic presence in the villages of Bellwood, Maywood and Broadview. Those scenarios were presented recently to the Archbishop, Francis George, O.M.I., after consultation and recommendations from the Archdiocesan council of priests.

Last week Cardinal George accepted the recommendation of the priests' council and decided that St. James Parish in Maywood will be closed and the facilities will be sold to the Knanaya Catholic Community, which is part of the Syro-Malabar Catholic Diocese, which is already located in Bellwood. The Knanaya Catholics are immigrants from the Archdiocese of Kottayam in India. The boundaries of St. Simeon Parish will cover all of Bellwood, while the territory of Broadview of St. Eulalia will cover all of Maywood and the northern part of Broadview. The portion of Broadview south of the I.C.G Railroad tracks will continue to be served by Mater Christi Parish in North Riverside.

These changes will become effective September 1, 2006. Father Herb Meyr has retired as Pastor of St. James Parish. Parishoners from St. James are invited to transfer to St. Simeon or St. Eulalia, or whatever parish may be closer to their home. Spanish Masses are already offered at St. Simeon and plans are underway to introduce Spanish services at St. Eulalia Parish.

Catholic Charities' Early Childhood Center will continue to operate in the former St. James school building at 611 Maple in Maywood. The food pantry at St. James will be transferred to a neighboring parish. There is an existing food pantry at St. Eulalia Parish.

With the assistance of the Archdiocesan Office of Research and Planning, Bishop Paprocki has met with the pastors and parish representatives to discuss the transition of parishioners from St. James to their new parishes and to welcome the Knanaya Catholic Community to the former St. James facilities.

Dear Rev. Fathers, Rev. Sisters, brothers and sisters in the Lord:

The grace and peace of Christ be with all of you. May I wish all of you the peace and joy of the great feast of Easter.

1. Regions and Directors:

I am glad to announce the formation of seven regions of our diocese in continuation of the discussion we had at the last Presbyteral meeting. This division is intended to get the greatest involvement of our people in the developmental programs of the diocese. Since our diocese is very vast we need to have our activities organized at regional levels in order to have a better participation of our members.

The Pastoral plan that we discussed and shared at the Presbyteral meeting and later at the Pastoral council may be used as a model for coordinating the various activities of the region. Family, youth, faith formation, diocesan conventions, Bible conventions and liturgical training are certain areas of special importance for our regional and national priorities. Special attention may be made to the possibility of creating new missions and parishes.

The Regional coordinators are expected to organize regional events of parishes and missions in the areas entrusted to them in consultation with the parish priests and directors of the missions.

I would request the support from all priests, sisters and lay people to promote the growth of our diocese to glorify our Lord. This arrangement becomes effective immediately.

Canada is not included in this arrangement.

Use Agreement between Saint Joseph Catholic Church of the Diocese of Joliet and the Knanaya Syro-Malabar Catholic Mission

We enter this agreement as Catholics, open to the call to Evangelize all people and to make our Church most intimately "Catholic."

he Usage of the Saint Joseph Parish Hall, for the Knanaya Syro-Malabar Catholic Mission, for Saturday evening Liturgy will commence on Saturday, June 18th, 2005. Liturgy will begin at 5:pm. Usage is from 4:00 pm on Saturday until 7:00 pm. (When Religious Education is in session it will be from 3:00 pm until 7:00 pm).

The Parish School will be available for use for Religious Education Saturday afternoons starting at 3:00 pm, ending at 5:30 pm.

There will be a few times in which the Parish of Saint Joseph will use the facilities (Hall and/or class rooms) on Saturdays. At these times, no services will be held in said facilities at Saint Joseph by the Syro-Malabar Community. These dates need to be communicated at minimum one month in advance.

The donation to Saint Joseph Church is to try to offset the cost of energy and upkeep for the cost of the buildings. Being mindful of the challenges of a Small Faith Community we agree to set the stipend to Saint Joseph at \$75.00 when there is no Religious Education going on and at \$150.00 when there is both worship and Religious Education. If there is a growth in the Syro-Malabar Community and their financial support, these stipends need to be evaluated by the Syro-Malabar Community and raised to assist Saint Joseph Parish meet its needs for the upkeep and maintenance of the parish facilities.

The Diocese of Joliet requires that the Knanaya Syro-Malabar Catholic Mission, provide a Certificate of Insurance that contains \$1,000,000.00 (One Million Dollars) proof of Liability Insurance coverage. The Parish of Saint Joseph and the Diocese of Joliet will

be named as additional insured in the Liability Insurance Policy.

It is understood that there will be an occasional use of the Kitchen facilities. For a broader use of the Kitchen there will be a \$25.00 stipend give to Saint Joseph.

Set up of the Hall and clean up are the responsibility of the Syro-Malabar Community. Also the parking will be kept to the north end of the West side Parking Lot and to Palmer Street, since there is Mass going on in Church for the Saint Joseph Parish Community at both 5:00 pm in English and at 7.00 pm in Spanish.

Any needed extension of time for celebrations after liturgy needs to be communicated with the Pastor (or in his stead the Business Manager).

The Parish Office Administrator is the usual person to begin contact with and to communicate with the Pastor and/or Business Manager.

There should be a quarterly meeting with Saint Joseph Pastor to evaluate this relationship.

This Agreement should be reevaluated by May 31st of 2006.

There is a one time Clean Up Deposit Fee of \$50.00 for use of the facilities. If there is no need for this to be used by the parish, then it will be returned at the end of the usuage agreement.

If at any time the Syro-Malabar community finds a need to move to another facility for worship, it must communicate this fact with the Pastor (or the Business Manager) about this change of situation.

Greetings to you all. From July 1999 to June 2004 I served as the Spiritual Director of the Knanaya Catholic Mission of Chicago. After attending the Houston Convention in 1999, I moved into the IHM Church in Chicago where Fr. Simon Edathiparambil entrusted the Mission to me before his return to India. I was warmly welcomed by KCS President Simon Pallikunnel and developed strong relationships with several good hearted members of the Chicago mission. With the cooperation of numerous hard working individuals I was able to initiate the following Mission activities.

In February 2000 I started "1st Saturday Mass" in Adisson, IL and then in Bloomingdale, IL. During that time, Mrs. Jose Vayalil took the initiative to start

the Eucharistic Celebration there. In February 2002 I started "the 3rd Saturday Mass" in Darien, IL. Until June 2004, I offered Holy Mass in these suburbs to meet the needs of the people in those areas.

With the help of some talented young adults, I started Catechism classes at the KCS Community Center in January 2001. These classes continued through May of 2004. I also offered masses at the KCS Community Center on Sundays in connection with the CCD classes. I am proud to say that one of those talented voung CCD teachers went on to become the President of KCYL Chicago. I remember, how the students followed my class. I am proud of a clever student of my class, who is the present President of KCYL while assessing my class, explained the Commandment



"Thou shalt not kill" that there are three types of killing; Physical killing, Mental killing and Spiritual killing; where spiritual killing is the most serious sin. I started Catechism classes with the special permission of Bp. Mathew Moolakkattu with an intention of starting Sunday mass at the KCS Community Center. Though the Archdiocese of Chicago inquired about it at the instigation of some individuals, the Chancellor raised no objection and I proceeded with weekly masses.

In between the Kids' club and KCYL there was no meet-



ing place for our youth. To solve spirituality is often ignored or back here with busy schedule. this issue, though objected by missing. Without promoting a few leaders, KCJL was inaugurated. I am happy to learn a Christian practically, because that it continues to functioning very smoothly and effectively. that our life is a gift of God and Young adults who came to America from India had no meeting place in Chicago. There were so many of them. They were called together and formed Youvajana Vedhi. This group was not formed for any vested interest, but some were apprehensive about creating another association. Today the Youvajana Vedhi continue to grow in size and this group has helped hundreds of young people transition from life in India to life in America.

of our community, has often endangered the maturity and healthy growth of our Community. Christianity and religiosity

A CHURCH THAT GREW STRONG AMIDST MANY HURDLES

ere is the history of the emergence of the first Knanaya Catholic Parish outside the ecclesiastical boundary of the Archeparchy of Kottayam. There have been unusual hurdles in its birth and early growth. However, in God's providence the final output is a very strong and vibrant parish.

The first difficulty to start a Knanaya parish in North America was the lack of Syro-Malabar church jurisdiction in North America. Knanaya Catholics began to migrate from Kerala to the United States from early 1950s. Many came for education and job opportunities. However, most of them settled down in this land of opportunities.

ISSUES UNDER LATIN HIERARCHY

The Knanaya Catholics who settled

in Chicago missed the liturgical service in the Syro-Malabar Rite in their own language, Malayalam. They found the arranging of Holy Mass as an opportunity for social get together along with meeting their pastoral needs. They got organized and requested His Excellency Mar Kuriakose Kunnacherry, then Bishop of Kottavam on January 17, 1981, to provide the service of a priest. Since Bishop Kunnacherry had no ecclesiastical jurisdiction here, he could not establish a Knanaya Syro-Malabar Mission in Chicago. So he wrote a letter to His Eminence John Cardinal Cody, the Archbishop of Chicago on March 18, 1981, to meet the pastoral needs of his people in Chicago by establishing a special ministry for the Knanaya Catholic Community here.

Cardinal Cody readily agreed to the recommendation of Mar Kuriakose Kunnacherry and requested him to

advise the name of a priest from Kottayam for this ministry. Mar Kunnacherry proposed the name of Rev. Fr. Jacob Chollampel, some other Kerala Catholics intervened and asked for a Malayalee priest common for Knanaya and non-Knanaya faithful irrespective of liturgical rites. This caused confusion for the Archdiocese and they postponed their decision in accepting Fr. Chollampel.

When Most Rev. Joseph Bernardin became the new Archbishop of Chicago, Mar Kunnacherry wrote to him to reconsider sending Fr. Chollampel from Kottayam. Because of different petitions from various Kerala Catholic associations, the chancellor of the Archdiocese of Chicago convened a meeting of representatives of these associations on September 27, 1983 and decided to accept Fr. Chollampel as a priest to serve all Kerala Catholics living in Chicago and suburbs.

After Fr. Jacob Chollampel came to Chicago in October 1983, he had problems in dealing with various factions of Knanaya and non-Knanaya people. Ad Hoc Committee for Syro-Malabar Catholic Association, in consultation with the chancellor of the Archdiocese of Chicago, requested to the Syro-Malabar Bishops' Conference on November 13, 1984 to provide a priest to serve the needs of the non-Knanaya Syro-Malabar community in Chicago. The Syro-Malabar Bishops' Conference held on December 3 and 4, 1984, authorized His Excellency Mar Joseph Pallikaparambil, Bishop of Palai to correspond with the Archdiocese of Chicago to appoint a priest for the non-Knanaya Syro-Malabarians in Chicago, in addition to Rev. Fr. Jacob Chollampel who was serving Knanaya Community. Thus Fr. Chollampel was assigned to serve only the Knanaya Catholics while another



priest was assigned later for the non-Knanaya Catholics in Chicago area.

Though Rev. Fr. Chollampel was relieved from serving the non-Knanaya Catholics, he still had problems on the membership issue of Knanaya mission in Chicago. Some of those who had left the Diocese of Kottayam and joined non-Knanaya Syro-Malabar diocese in India when they got married to non-Knanava spouses began to demand membership in the Knanaya Catholic Mission in Chicago. They petitioned to the Archbishop of Chicago and to the Sacred Congregation for the Oriental Churches in Rome and got favorable reply from them. However, those who came from the Diocese of Kottayam strongly opposed this and wanted to continue the membership of the Knanava Catholic Mission as it has been practiced in the Diocese of Kottayam.

The membership issue of Knanaya mission continued during the service periods of the mission directors Fr. Cyriac Manthuruthil, Fr. Simon Edathiparambil, and Fr. Philip Thodukayil who succeeded Fr. Chollampel. Because of constant conflict on this issue in the community, these mission directors could not concentrate on developing better pastoral programs for the community. Even their position as mission directors was under constant threat when the Knanaya Mission in Chicago was under the Archdiocese of Chicago.

ISSUES WITH SYRO-MALABAR DIOCESE

When the Syro-Malabar Diocese of Chicago was established in 2001, the pastoral care of the Knanaya Catholics came under this diocese. Bishop Mar Kuriakose Kunnacherry and Knanaya Catholics welcomed it under the expectation that this would solve their issues and that they can practice as

they do in the Diocese of Kottayam. However, the Sacred Congregation for the Oriental Churches gave special instruction to Mar Jacob Angadiath, the Bishop of the St. Thomas Syro-Malabar Diocese of Chicago with regard to the pastoral care of the Knanava faithful in his diocese. The Congregation acknowledged the special cultural background of the Knanaya Catholics and instructed Mar Angadiath that he shall establish Knanaya missions and parishes with Knanaya priests as their pastors. However, the Congregation made it clear that such pastoral care shall not make any allowance for endogamy to play a role in defining the membership of faithful in any mission or parish. This caused disappointment among Knanaya Catholics.

Though there were dialogues between Mar Angadiath and Knanaya Catholic Congress of North America (KCCNA) representatives, there could not be any mutual understanding. Bishop had to hold on to the instructions of the Oriental Congregation and KCCNA had to stick on to the endogamous nature of the community as it has been practiced in the Diocese of Kottayam. This resulted in non-cooperation of the Knanaya

Community with the diocese under the leadership of KCCNA and its local units. Though Bishop Mar Jacob Angadiath reestablished 10 Knanaya Missions in the diocese, most people did not want to cooperate with these missions and prevented the development of these missions. The Knanaya mission directors have been in a conflicting situation. So they could not function well except taking care of the minimum pastoral needs of the people.

KCCNA representatives and Knanaya Mission directors sent a petition with the endorsement of Mar Jacob Angadiath to the Oriental Congregation to reconsider the instruction to resolve this issue. The congregation did not make any further step. The issue is still unresolved. So the Knanaya Catholics in the USA have been against establishing further Knanaya missions or building churches for the existing Knanaya missions. Most of them go to the local Latin Churches or some to the local Syro-Malabar churches.

ISSUES ON KNANAYA CHRUCH IN CHICAGO

During the visit of Mar Mathew Moolakkattu, then Auxiliary Bishop of Kottayam in May 2005 for the feast of St. Michael organized by the Knanaya Catholic Mission of Chicago, he was impressed with the outcome of the religious education schools and pastoral activities of the mission under the new pastoral leadership of Vicar General Fr. Abraham Mutholath. Having convinced the great role the Knanaya mission or parish can have on the total development of the Knanaya Community in North America, Bishop Moolakkattu advised the Knanaya Catholics in Chicago to establish a church of their own during his homily at IHM Church during

Sunday Mass on May 22, 2005. The mission director Fr. Abraham Mutholath during his announcement at the end of the Holy Mass declared that, considering the large number of Knanaya Catholics widespread in Chicago and suburbs, he would try to establish two churches for the mission here. Many questioned the idea of having a Knanaya Church while the membership issue of the mission or parish is unresolved.

Fr. Mutholath formed a fund raising committee with Mr. Mathachan Chemmachel as the general convener. Balance amount from the celebration of feasts of saints were set apart as the seed money for the proposed new church. The fundraising committee worked hard to raise fund for the proposed church.

Many factors favored to facilitate the desire of the Knanaya Catholics in Chicago to buy a church. Fr. Mutholath introduced a prayer for the church to be said daily at homes and at the end of liturgy. He wrote on the relevance of having our own church in the Sunday bulletin of the mission. Fr. Mutholath had reestablished the Religious Education School at Community Center with two schools with more students at IHM School and North Lake Church. The property owners used to complain on the inappropriate use of

the property. This favored the desire to buy own property. Because of increase in attendance of Religious Education schools every year, the participants of Sunday Mass also increased. The setup for Mass at North Lake Church and later at basement of Addison School was hard for the volunteers of the mission. They desired for a Knanaya Church. Mission introduced many other pastoral activities that showed the need of own building for the smooth functioning of such programs. Gradually many people began to think in favor of establishing a church of our own.

A few leaders of the community met with Bishop Thomas Paprocki, the Auxiliary bishop of Chicago requesting his help to purchase a church from the Archdiocese of Chicago for Knanaya Catholic Society (KCS). Bishop clarified that an association cannot own a church for Catholics. Since the Archdiocese of Chicago can sell a church only to another diocese, he offered them help to get a church for the Knanaya Mission, if they approach through the mission director and Bishop Angadiath.

Fr. Abraham Mutholath, the mission director, Mr. Joy Vachachira, the team leader of the group that met Bishop Paprocki, and Mar Jacob Angadiath approached Bishop Thomas Paprocki to discuss on the possibility of buying a church for the Knanaya Mission in Chicago. Bishop Paprocki gave the options to buy a church in Chicago that has no parking lot, to lease St. Eulelia Church, or to buy St. James Church in Maywood. Because of low revenue and comparatively high expense of three nearby parishes in Maywood and Melrose Park, the Archdiocese of Chicago was considering closing down one parish and merging the parishioners with the other two. The team declined the offer of the church without any parking facility. The team members went with Bishop Paprocki to see St. Eulelia and St. James churches and to discuss with their pastors.

Since St. Eulelia and St. James were active parishes in Maywood, there was chance of protest from either parish when they come to know of closing down their church. So Bishop Paprocki requested Bishop Angadiath, Fr. Mutholath, and Mr. Joy to keep the discussions and decisions strictly confidential until discussions and decisions are made in parish and archdiocesan bodies and Cardinal's decree was released.

Cardinal Francis George proposed through Bishop Paprocki to lease St. Eulelia Church and its facilities for 30 years with opportunity of renewal for more terms so that the Archdiocese won't lose the ownership of the church and it can reestablish its parish in case the situation might change. Bishop Paprocki held a general body meeting of St. Eulelia parish to discuss the matter. There were objections on closing that parish. A few who do not know the Knanaya Community made accusations of the membership issue of Knanaya Mission. So Bishop Paprocki proposed some conditions in the lease agreement of the church that the search team could not accept. So



the only alternative was to request the purchase of St. James Church.

Bishop Paprocki held a general body meeting of St. James Parish. Many parishioners objected to the sale of their church. Report of the meeting along with the proposal for sale of St. James Church was presented in the Pastoral Council of Archdiocese of Chicago for approval. Cardinal Francis George presided over the meeting. The council postponed the decision asking for more details of the Knanaya Catholic Mission and St. James parishioners. Pastoral Council wanted another meeting of St. James Parishioners to find out their choice of joining nearby parishes so that the council can decide to which parish the money from sale of the church property might go. Most of the parishioners were Spanish speaking and their decision was to join two parishes. The pastoral council in its next meeting decided to sell St. James church to Knanava Mission and to divide the money from sales to those two parishes.

Prior to the purchase of the church and announcement of which church we were going to buy, Knanaya Catholic Mission had the solemn feast celebration of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus from May 25 to 28, 2006 sponsored by the immigrants from the Sacred Heart Parish in Kottavam. Archbishop Emeritus of Kottayam, Mar Kuriakose Kunnacherry was the chief guest. At the request of the office bearers of the Knanaya Mission, Mar Jacob Angadiath announced at KCS Community Center on May 25, 2006 that Sacred Heart of Jesus will be the patron of the new church to be bought and the proposed parish will be named as "Sacred Heart Knanaya Catholic Parish of Chicago."

Though collection for the purchase of the church was going on, no one else was aware of the church to be bought.

because of the restriction given by the Archdiocese of Chicago. Cardinal Francis George signed the decree closing St. James Church and selling the property to Knanaya Catholic Mission. However, Knanaya Catholic Mission had to wait until Cardinal's decree was revealed to St. James parishioners on June 18, 2006. That was heartbreaking news for the pastor and parishioners of St. James. Many of them were crying at the loss of their church that was 98 years old and the first church of the Archdiocese of Chicago in Maywood. However, the church and school building were only 48 years old.

The originally planned date to hand over St. James Church to Knanaya Catholic Mission was on July 1, 2006 and the inauguration of the new church and parish was scheduled to be held on July 15, 2006. Because of the delay in the decision of the Archdiocese of Chicago, it was agreed to share the church between St. James and Sacred Heart parishioners until September 1, 2006.

According to this plan Knanaya Catholic Mission had invited Archbishop Mar Mathew Moolakkattu and Archbishop Emeritus Mar Kuriakose Kunnacherry from Kottayam for the inauguration along with Bishop Mar Jacob Angadiath. Both the archbishops came to Chicago for this function.

While preparations were on the way, Archdiocese of Chicago allowed us to announce the name of the church to be bought from them to Knanaya Catholic Community. Mission Director Rev. Fr. Abraham Mutholath revealed the location of the proposed church to be bought on Saturday, June 24, 2006 at Thaft High School Auditorium after the Music Concert by Rev. Paul Poovathumkal and fundraising program for the church by women's

ministry. He also made a power point presentation of St. James Church and distributed a printed leaflet of the church. The members of the mission received this announcement with joy. The next day was an open house. Many mission members came to see their future church after 5:30 P.M. Holy Mass at OLV Church. Those who came were happy about what they got. We had a thanksgiving prayer service in the church under the leadership of Rev. Fr. Thomas Tharayil who was in Chicago for a visit.

Bishop Mar Jacob Angadiath offered a dinner at his bishop's house in Cicero in honor of Cardinal Francis George on Tuesday, June 27th 2006 in appreciation for providing St. James Church for the Knanava Mission. At the same time fundraising committee of the mission met at KCS Community Center to raise the balance fund for the purchase of St. James Church and rectory. That meeting was well attended. Some people distributed an internet printout stating that the crime rate in the City of Maywood was high. They argued that it was not appropriate to buy the church for this reason. They



demanded the purchase of any other church. The majority of those who attended the meeting favored this proposal.

The fund raised at that time was \$500,000 and the money required to buy St. James Church and rectory was \$975,000. It was impossible to buy a church in a better area with such a low amount available.

An open discussion was held on next Thursday June 29th after liturgical services at the Community Center. That meeting was also well attended. Some people who had opposed the purchase of St. James church earlier and some who were volunteers for the Mass of the Mission at Addison favored the purchase of St. James Church at that meeting. But majority who attended the meeting spoke strongly against the purchase of this church. Fr. Mutholath informed the assembly that he will inform the concerns of the people to the bishops and let them decide whatever is best for the community.

Those who oppose the purchase of St. James Church approached Mar Jacob Angadiath and requested him not to allow the purchase of the church. Those who favored the purchase of the church also met with the bishop to present their request. Because of the strong opposition and divided views, Mar Jacob Angadiath suspended the decision on the purchase of St. James Church. So the inauguration of the church and parish could not take place on July 15, 2006 as scheduled.

Archbishops Mar Mathew Moolakkatt and Mar Kuriakose Kunnacherry came to Chicago as scheduled for the inaugural function of the church. Those who favor and those who oppose the purchase of the church met with both archbishops and presented their concerns. Those who

favored the purchase argued that if we do not buy this church there is less chance to have a church of our own in Chicago in the near future.

Though the inaugural mass on the evening of Saturday, July 15, 2006 at Maywood was cancelled, both Archbishops and Mar Jacob Angadiath agreed to have a concelebrated mass by them at the basement of St. Joseph's Church in Addison at the same time and at OLV church on the next day at 5:30 P.M. Before the Mass at Addison on July 15th, Archbishops Mar Mathew Moolakkatt and Mar Kuriakose Kunnacherry, along with Bishop Thomas Paprocki, Fr. Abraham Mutholath and some lay representatives met with Mar Jacob Angadiath at the Cathedral Church of the diocese recommending him to decide in favor of the purchase of the church and to announce that during the Holy Mass at Addison on that day. Mar Jacob Angadiath said he wanted written assurance from more that half of the families of the mission, that is 400 families stating that they will support this church if it is bought. So the announcement could not be made during that Holy Mass. The people who attended the Holy Mass in Addison were grieving during that Mass when they were supposed to have the inaugural Mass at Maywood. Some priests and lavpeople from out of state who were invited for the church inauguration were also present for this Mass.

Respecting the decision of Mar Angadiath, some volunteers of the Knanaya Mission volunteered the signature campaign immediately after the Mass in favor of the purchase of Maywood church. Parish Inauguration Banquet was scheduled at Crown Jewel Banquet Hall in Des Plaines on the evening of July 16th 2006. Only those who favored the purchase of the

parish came for this banquet that could not be cancelled because of the arrangements already made. Both archbishops and Mar Jacob Angadiath came for the banquet. The lavpeople who did the signature campaign in support of the purchase of the church presented to Mar Jacob Angadiath the packet that contained the agreement of more than 400 families assuring their willingness to support the proposed church. So Mar Jacob Angadiath announced that he is allowing the purchase of St. James Church for Knanaya Catholic Mission, That was a joyful occasion for the people who were gathered there.

Because of this serious division in the community on the purchase of St. James Church, many declined to support financially for the purchase of the church. So we could not raise the full amount on time. The Archdiocese of Chicago allowed us to complete the purchase in two phases. We bought the Church and School for \$800,000 by giving full payment and took possession of the property with effect from September 1, 2006. Archdiocese of Chicago allowed us six months to raise the balance 175,000 to purchase the rectory. During this time we were renting the rectory for \$1,500 per month that was credited to the purchase value. We raised that amount in three months after six months we purchased the rectory also.

The first Mass of the Knanaya Mission at St. James Church was held on Friday September 1, 2006 at 7:00 P.M. The inauguration of the parish was held on Sunday September 3, 2006 at 10:00 A.M. by Mission Director Fr. Abraham Mutholath and parish council members by lighting nilavilakku that has 72 flames. Archbishops and Bishop Jacob Angadiath were in India for Syro-Malabar Bishops' Synod in Kerala. After the return of Bishop Mar Jacob

Angadiath to the U.S., he elevated the Knanaya Mission as Sacred Heart Knanaya Catholic Parish on Sunday, September 24th at 10:00 A.M. and appointed Rev. Fr. Abraham Mutholath as its first pastor. Since then the parish got great support from the parishioners and it is functioning with maximum involvement of the people.

DEVOTION TO OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE

Since the starting of Holy Mass in North Lake on Saturdays, we were having novena of Our Lady of Perpetual Help. We continue that devotion in Maywood. However, it happened that we also started devotion to Our Lady of Guadalupe because of a special reason.

The majority of attendees of St. James Church before we bought the church was people of Hispanic background. They had special devotion to Our Lady of Guadalupe. They had a wooden statue of Our Lady of Guadalupe that they had bought from Guadalupe where Our Blessed Mother appeared to Blessed Juan Diego in 1531. Hispanic people in and around Chicago considered St. James Church as their pilgrim place to honor Our Lady of Guadalupe. So they used to come to pay special homage to this statue. When they heard their sad news that this church was going to be sold to Knanaya Community, their humble request was to let them take that statue to their next church. So we allowed them to do so.

The parish committee decided that a pilgrimage shall go to Guadalupe and buy another statue of Our Lady of Guadalupe from this miraculous place. So, 51 parishioners went to Mexico under the leadership of Fr. Abraham Mutholath and Joy Chemmachel from September 14 to 16, 2006. Besides the statue of Our Lady of Guadalupe, they also bought many other statues and church materials to furnish Sacred

Heart Church. The pilgrims sponsored all such materials. Since the erection of the statue of Our Lady of Guadalupe in our church in a special place set apart, many people pray at that shrine and witness that they also get many miraculous blessings through the intercession of our Blessed Mother.

FORMATION OF ST. MARY'S UNIT

Though the Sacred Heart Knanaya Catholic Parish was inaugurated with regular mass on Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays, we continued Holy Mass on Thursdays with novena of St. Jude at Community Center and Sunday 5:30 P.M. Mass at OLV Church in Chicago. This arrangement was continued respecting the views of those who opposed the purchase of St. James Church in Maywood and to meet their pastoral needs because they have been reluctant to come to Maywood Church.

The Knanaya Mission always had Christmas and Holy Week services together. Considering this and also the difficulty to get a church at our convenience, the Christmas mass was arranged for all at Maywood church. Those who had declined to come to opposed this Maywood complained to Mar Angadiath. Considering their strong request, Mar Angadiath allowed to organize separate pastoral programs for them at OLV church or other convenient churches. So a separate Christmas Mass was arranged also at Cathedral Church on December 25, 2006.

Considering this unwillingness of many to compromise with the parish church in Maywood, Fr. Abraham Mutholath sent a circular to all the parishioners informing that he would consider those who do not come to Maywood as St. Mary's Unit and will continue pastoral service for them at convenient churches until a second church is established for the Knanaya

Community in Chicago in honor of Our Blessed Mother. Thus St. Mary's Unit was formed under the parish with effect from January 1, 2007. Separate Sunday Mass, Religious Education School, accounts, committee, and pastoral programs are organized now for St. Mary's Unit. Since the formation of St. Mary's Unit, prayer for the second church has started at homes and after liturgy in the parish church and in St. Mary's Unit. We are hoping and praying for the St. Mary's Church in Chicago in the near future.

PRESENT STATUS OF SACRED HEART CHURCH IN MAYWOOD

In spite of all the negative rumors on the Maywood Church, many people came to the church on a regular basis and felt comfortable participating in the liturgy there. Children and youth feel it as their "second home." During 2007-'08 academic year, we had 350 students and 80 young teachers in the Sacred Heart Religious Education School besides 120 students 40 young teachers at St. Mary's Unit. Since the number of Sunday Mass attendees rose to an average of 1,500, we started Syro-Malabar Mass in English for Children and youth at 11:30 A.M. after their catechism class that is conducted during Malayalam Mass for adults. The parish has pious associations and ministries for parishioners of all ages. We also have koodarayogams (ward prayer meetings) for the parishioners. Many people do voluntary service for the church. Those who visit from outside the parish praise the activities of the church saying that they have never seen such a vibrant parish elsewhere. They began to recommend such churches for the community all over the United States. The City of Maywood and neighbors of the church are very receptive to our community. The parishioners are grateful to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus and His blessed Mother for all the blessings we receive through this church.





വ്വീം ഡി. 345ൽ ടൈഗ്രീസ് നദീതീരത്തു നിന്നും മൂന്നു പായ് കപ്പലുകളിൽ ക്നാനായ ക്കാർ കച്ചവടത്തിനും കൃഷിയ്ക്കും സുവി ശേഷവല്ക്കരണത്തിനുമായി കൊടുങ്ങല്ലൂ രിൽ വന്നു ചേർന്നുവെങ്കിൽ 1957-58 കാല യളവിൽ ഇപ്പോഴത്തെ ക്നാനായ ആസ്ഥാ നമായ കോട്ടയത്തുനിന്നും പ്രാന്ത പ്രദേശ ങ്ങളിൽ നിന്നുമായി തറയിൽ തൊമ്മിക്കു ഞ്ഞ്, പെണ്ണമ്മ തറയിൽ, ഫിലിപ്പ് കാലാ യിൽ, കുഞ്ചാക്കോ പുവത്തുങ്കൽ, തോമ്മാ ച്ചൻ തച്ചേട്ട് തുടങ്ങിയവർ വിദ്യാഭ്യാസ ത്തിനും ജോലിയ്ക്കുമായി അവസരങ്ങളുടെ നാടായ അമേരിക്കയിൽ വന്നു. അവരും പിന്നീടു വന്നവരും തങ്ങളുടെ ബന്ധുമിത്രാ ദികളെ ഇവിടെ കൊണ്ടുവന്നു. ഇപ്പോൾ വിവിധ തൊഴിലുകളിൽ പ്രാവീണ്യമുള്ള വരും എച്ച്-1 വീസായിൽ ഇവിടെ വന്നുചേ രുന്നു. അങ്ങനെ ഏതാണ്ട് 800 ക്നാനായ കത്തോലിക്കാ കുടുംബങ്ങൾ ഇന്നു ചിക്കാഗോ ഭാഗത്തുണ്ട്.

ഇവിടെ കുടിയേറിയവർ കോട്ടയത്തു നിന്നും വൈദികരെ വരുത്തി നമ്മുടെ തന്നെ റീത്തിൽ തിരുക്കർമ്മങ്ങൾ നടത്തുവാൻ താല്പര്യം കാണിച്ചു. കൂടാതെ 1993ൽ കമ്മ്യൂണിറ്റി സെന്റർ വാങ്ങിക്കുകയും സമീ പത്തുള്ള ഐ.എച്ച്.എം. പള്ളിയിൽ തിരു ക്കർമ്മങ്ങൾ നടത്തുകയും ചെയ്തുപോന്നു. പള്ളിയേക്കാളുപരി സംഘടനയ്ക്കു നാം പ്രാധാന്യം നൽകി പോന്നിരുന്നതിനാൽ നമ്മുടെ വൈദികരോ അത്മായരോ സ്വന്ത മായ പള്ളിയ്ക്കുവേണ്ടി അടുത്തകാലം വരെ താല്പര്യമെടുത്തില്ല. അതിൽ മാറ്റം വരുത്തുവാൻ നേതൃത്വം നൽകിയത് നമ്മുടെ ഇപ്പോഴത്തെ വികാരി റവ. ഫാ. ഏബ്രഹാം മുത്തോലത്താണ്.

രിൽനിന്നു കടുത്തുരുത്തിയിലും കോട്ട യത്തും കല്ലിശ്ശേരിയിലും തുടങ്ങി കുടിയേ റിയ സ്ഥലങ്ങളിലെല്ലാം ആദ്യം ചെയ്തത് പള്ളി പണിത് സമുദായംഗങ്ങൾ ഒന്നു ചേർന്ന് ദൈവത്തെ, ആരാധിക്കുകയായിരു ന്നു. തൽഫലമായി നമ്മുടെ സമുദായത്തിന് കേരളത്തിലുണ്ടായ നേട്ടങ്ങൾ അനവധിയാ ണല്ലോ. കോളേജുകൾ, പ്ലസ്ടു വിദ്യാലയ ങ്ങൾ, സ്കൂളുകൾ, ആശുപത്രികൾ, തൊഴിൽ സ്ഥാപനങ്ങൾ, സന്ന്യാസ സമൂഹ ങ്ങൾ, സാമുഹ്യ ക്ഷേമ പദ്ധതികൾ എന്നി ങ്ങനെ ഏറെ കാര്യങ്ങൾ സഭാ സംവിധാന ത്തിലൂടെ നാം നേടി.

ചിക്കാഗോയിലെ ക്നാനായ സമുദായ ത്തിന്റെ അജപാലന വളർച്ചയിൽ പുതി യൊരു പസ്ഥാവു വെട്ടിത്തുറക്കുവാൻ 2004ൽ ക്നാനായ കാത്തലിക് മിഷന്റെ ഡയറക്ട റായി ചുമതലയേറ്റ ബഹു. മുത്തോലത്ത ച്ചനു കഴിഞ്ഞു. അദ്ദേഹത്തിന്റെ ത്യാഗോ ജ്ജാല സേവനത്തിന്റെ ഫലമായി 2006 സെപ്തംബർ ഒന്നു മുതൽ ഈ പ്രവാസി നാട്ടിൽ നമുക്കു സ്വന്തമായൊരു ദൈവാ ലയം നിലവിൽ വന്നു. വികാരിയച്ചനും പാരീഷ് കൗൺസിൽ അംഗങ്ങളും ചേർന്ന് സെപ്തംബർ മൂന്നിന് 72 തിരിയുള്ള നില വിളക്കു കത്തിച്ച് പ്രാർത്ഥനാന്തരീക്ഷത്തിൽ ലളിതമായി ഇടവകയുടെ ഉദ്ഘാടനം നിർവ്വ ഹിച്ചു. സെപ്തംബർ 24ന് രൂപതാദ്ധ്യക്ഷൻ മാർ ജേക്കബ് അങ്ങാടിയാത്തു പിതാവ് നമ്മുടെ മിഷനെ പ്രവാസി ക്നാനായ ക്കാരുടെ പ്രഥമ ഇടവകയായി ഉയർത്തി.

കഴിഞ്ഞ ഒരു വർഷമായി ഈ ഇടവ കയ്ക്കും ഇതിനോടു സഹകരിക്കുന്ന വർക്കും അത്ഭുതകരമായ നേട്ടങ്ങളാണ് ഉണ്ടായിക്കൊണ്ടിരിക്കുന്നത്. മുഴുവൻ വിലയും രൊക്കമായി നൽകി പള്ളിയും സ്കൂളും ഇരിക്കുന്ന ബ്ലോക്കു നിശ്ചിത സമ യത്തു തന്നെ വാങ്ങുവാൻ കഴിഞ്ഞു. ആറു മാസത്തിനകം പള്ളിയോടു ചേർന്ന മറ്റൊരു സ്ഥലവും കെട്ടിടവും പള്ളിമേടയ്ക്കും ഓഫീസിനുമായി മുഴുവൻ തുകയും കൊടുത്തു വാങ്ങുവാൻ കഴിഞ്ഞു. ക്യൂൻ ഓഫ് ഹെവൻ സെമിത്തേരിയിൽ 1460 പേരെ സംസ്കരിക്കുവാൻ ക്നാനായ കത്തോലി ക്കർക്കു മാത്രമായി ഒരു പ്രദേശം വേർതിരി ച്ചുകിട്ടി. നമ്മുടെ ഇടവക ഇൻഡ്യയിലെ മിയാവു രൂപതയെ സ്പോൺസർ ചെയ്യു കയും നമ്മളും നമ്മുടെ വികാരി ബഹു. മുത്തോലത്തച്ചനും സംഭാവന നൽകി രണ്ടു പള്ളികൾ മിയാവു രൂപതയിൽ നിർമ്മിച്ചു കൊണ്ടിരിക്കുന്നു. അടുത്ത ജനുവരിയിൽ അവരുടെ കൂദാശ കർമ്മം നടക്കുമെന്നറിയു ന്നു. നമ്മുടെ പള്ളിയോടനുബന്ധിച്ച് വിപു ലമായ സൗകര്യങ്ങളുള്ള യുത്ത് സെന്റർ നിർമ്മിക്കുവാനിരിക്കുന്നു. അതിനുള്ള അടി സ്ഥാന ശില അത്യുന്നത കർദ്ദിനാളും സീറോ മലബാർ സഭാതലവനുമായ മാർ വർക്കി വിതയത്തിൽ തിരുമേനി നിർവ്വഹി ക്കുകയുണ്ടായി. സർവ്വോപരി ഈ ഇടവക വഴി നമ്മുടെ കുഞ്ഞുങ്ങൾക്കും യുവതീയു വാക്കൾക്കും മറ്റെല്ലാവർക്കും എന്തെന്നി ല്ലാത്ത അത്മീയ ഉണർവ്വും മാനസിക സന്തോഷവും സംജാതമായിരിക്കുന്നു. ഇവ യെല്ലാം ദൈവത്തിന്റെ അത്ഭുതമല്ലാതെ മറ്റെ

ഈ ഉയർച്ചയ് കൈല്ലാം കാരണം സേക്രഡ് ഹാർട്ട് ക്നാനായ ഇടവകയുടെ ഉത്ഭവവും ഈ പള്ളിയുടെ ആഭിമുഖ്യത്തിൽ രൂപീകൃ തമായ വിവിധ സംഘടനകളും പ്രസ്ഥാ നങ്ങളു മാണ്. പളളി യുടെ പ്രാർത്ഥനാ ഗ്രൂപ്പും, സെന്റ് വിൻസന്റ് ഡി പോൾ സൊസൈറ്റിയും, ലീജിയൺ ഓഫ് മേരിയും, കുട്ടികളുടെ ആരാധനയും, ദിവൃ ബലിയ്ക്കു ശേഷം ദൈവാലയത്തിനും യൂത്ത് സെന്ററിനും വേണ്ടിയുള്ള പ്രാർത്ഥ നയുമെല്ലാം ഏറെ ദൈവാനുഗ്രഹം വർഷിക്കുന്നതിനുള്ള മാർഗ്ഗങ്ങളായി ഭവിക്കുന്നു.



St. James Church

On June 4, 1908, Archbishop James E. Quigley appointed Rev. James E. O'Shea to organize a parish "in the town of Maywood, west of the DesPlaines River and Oak Park and south and east of Melrose Park." The new parish encompassed all of Maywood, a village located 11 miles west of Chicago's downtown business district.

Following his ordination in Ireland in 1893, Father O'Shea came to Chicago where he served for the next 13 years as an assistant at St. Anne (now St. Charles Lwanga) Church. Prior to his appointment in Maywood, he had been pastor of Holy Cross Church in Batavia, IL. (now in the Joliet diocese). Father O'Shea celebrated Mass in Maywood for the

first time on June 21, 1908 in Meyer's hall.

Property has been secured for a church, school, convent and parochial residence. A house has been rented at 212 S. 6th ave. for the pastor until a rectory will be built.

On Tuesday, Sept. 29, 1908, ground at 301 S. 7th ave. was broken for a four story combination building. Mass in the new quarters was celebrated for the first time on Mar. 28, 1909 and St. James Church was dedicated on May 16, 1909 by Archbishop Quigley. It is said that the combination building satisfied the requirements of parish life so well that six new parishes in the Archdiocese used St. James Church and school structure as a model.

The Dominican Sisters from

Adrian, Mich. opened the parish school in September 1909 with an enrollment of 60 pupils. St. James was the first of many schools in the Archdiocese of Chicago to be staffed by members of this religious order.

In 19108003 persons lived in Maywood and the Catholic population then numbered 218 families. An advertisement in the Maywood Herald in 1911 contained the information that

A commercial course, embracing book keeping, typewriting, stenography, arithmetic, grammar, commercial law, English punctuation, spelling and penmanship is taught at St. James School. All Catholic and non-Catholic pupils must have completed the eighth grade to take the course. Music pupils receive

special attention. St. James Hall for rent to the public.

On Apr. 10, 1925, the Peters' home at 307 S. 7th ave. was bought and remodelled as a convent for the Adrian Dominicans who staffed St. James school. The population of Maywood boomed during the 1920s, increasing from 12,072 to 25,829 between 1920 and 1930. The Catholic community was growing so rapidly that George Cardinal Mundelein authorized the formation of St. Eulalia parish in 1927 to serve families living in south Maywood and the adjoining village of Broadview. In 1930, St. Simeon parish was established in Bellwood, a suburb directly east of Maywood.

Like other parishes in the western suburbs, St. James experienced steady growth as Catholic families moved from the city to the suburbs following World War II. Between 1940 and 1950, parish membership increased dramatically, from 350 to 1,142 families.

On Feb. 2, 1948, Rev. Charles L. Wallace, an assistant at St. James parish since 1945, was named administrator. Following Father O'shea's death on Dec. 2, 1951 at the age of 81, Father Wallace was named pastor in February 1952.

At the time of the golden jubilee of St. James parish, which was celebrated on June 1, 1958, 344 children were enrolled in the school under the direction of six Adrian Dominicans and two lay teachers.

On June 21, 1963, a small group of active parishioners met to discuss the possibility of a new church and school. John Aldworth was delegated to contact the

Archdiocesan Chancery Office for advice and guidance. One week later he reported back to the group of laymen. Three members of the group subsequently met with Father Wallace to offer their cooperation and services in setting up a building program.

To assess the feelings of parishioners, a census was taken under the direction of associate pastor Rev. John M. Lane, George Cassady, and Felix Ciechanowski. A majority of St. James parishioners favored the plan and Father Wallace then began to attend meetings at the Chancery Office to obtain the necessary information and permission to build. The pastor's health began to fail and he was forced to be in the hospital on several occasions. Early in 1965, he decided to retire from parish life. Named pastor emeritus in February 1965, he



accepted a post as chaplain at Mercy Hospital. Father Wallace died on June 13, 1970 at the age of 67.

Rev. William J. Buhrfeind, a former assistant at St. Francis Xavier Church in Wilmette, IL., was named pastor on Feb. 8, 1965. Following a successful pledge campaign, Archbishop John P. Code granted permission for construction to begin on a new church and school. Architectural firms submitted proposed sketches and a committee of parishoners selected the firm of Kiefer & Pilolla to design the new St. James Church and school.

On Oct. 23, 1966, ground at the southwest corner of 6th ave. and Maple St. was broken for the new church and school which would replace the combination building erected in 1908. The church was designed in such a way that it invites total participation at Mass. Four rows of pews fan out from the sanctuary, giving worshippers an unobstructed view of the sanctuary: the seacting capacity is 600 persons. The school at 611 Maple St. is connected to the church by a foyer; it contains eight classrooms, a library, and on office.

Cardinal Cody dedicated St. James Church on May 12, 1968. The New World noted that presently, this integrated parish serves 650 families. The school, staffed by the Adrian (Mich.) Dominicans, has 280 pupils. The one-level building is constructed of red matched brick and follows a modern style.

In January 1971, Father Buhrfeind was named pastor of St. Raymond de Penafort Church in Mount Prospect, III. From 1971 to 1973, Rev. James T. O'Connor and Rev. A.Paul Reicher served as co-pastors of St. James Church. On Sept. 19, 1973, Father O'Connor was appointed pastor of Our Lady of Loretto Church in Hometown, III., and Father Reicher was named administrator of St. James parish.

In 1972, the original parish church and school building was demolished. In the early 1970s, the Women's Club of St. James parish established a "Happy Hours Club" for senior citizens in cooperation with Catholic Charities of Chicago. A Social Care Program organized with the help of Catholic Charities in June 1973 reaches hundreds of Maywood residents, many of whom are not parishioners.


In 1976, the Archdiocese gave the parish \$5, 132 to cover half the cost of a new school roof. In a letter to Cardinal Cody, the business commission of the parish expressed its gratitude for this assistance as well as for indirect subsidies granted to the parish each year. The letter read, in pertinent part the St. James Parish community is rather unique in the metropolitan area of Chicago, comprising a racial and cultural blend of black, white and Spanish speaking persons. The fact that the Archdiocese has made an investment in our parish is a sign to us that the Archdiocese is seriously trying to promote the continuation and development of one of the rew really integrated or racially and culturally mixed parishes in the Archdiocese. The spirit of cooperation and respect among our parishioner is a real sign of hope for persons who believe that all truly can live in peace and harmony with one another.

A multi-racial and cultural par-

ish, St. James serves approximately 500 families who live in that part of Maywood which is bounded by the village limits on the north: Madison St. on the south; the east side of 22nd ave. on the west; and the Des Plaines River on the east. The parish membership is approximately 55% white, 35% black, and 10% Spanish. The black population of Maywood increased from about 3% in 1930 to 19% in 1960. The number of black families belonging to the parish grew steadily during the 1960s. The parish's Spanish population, which is mainly Mexican-American, did not begin to increase until the early 1970s. While the parish has committees on Liturgy, Social Action, Parish Life, Education, and Business, they do not operate in the same way as a traditional Parish Council. In St. James parish, individual committees are responsible for a certain area of parish life and have the responsibility and authority to develop and implement programs in that particular area. Active parish groups include the School Board, Women's Society, CCD, Teen Club, Prayer Group, Senior Citizens Club, and Social Care Program.

St. James parish has extensive involvement in the Maywood community and holds membership in the local Chamber of Commerce. The school building is open to many non-parish groups. The parish also cooperates with Triton College in nearby River Grove, IL. for educational programs, especially English classes and the GED program.







Chronology of Events in The Knanaya Catholic Parish in Chicago

1980 December 13

Twenty one members of the Kottayam diocese living in Chicago and surrounding areas gathered and decided to request to the Bishop of Kottayam for a priest from Kottayam diocese to serve the community here. The assembly delegated Chacko Poovathumkal, George Kappadakunnel (Convener), and Rajan Kalladanthil to draft the petition to the Bishop of Kottayam.

1980 December 20

A meeting of Knanaya Catholics in Chicago approved the draft petition and compiled the list of Knanaya Catholics in the area. Four groups were formed for a petition drive for the appeal to the Diocese of Kottayam.

1981 January 17

The petition collected by the four teams was compiled. Two hundred and five people signed the petition in 36 sheets. The meeting delegated the committee to submit the petition.

The following is the copy of petition submitted by each family to Mar Kuriakose Kunnacherry, Bishop of Kottayam dated January 17, 1981:

"We the undersigned faithful of the Diocese of Kottayam wish to submit this petition for your kind consideration. We have a substantial number

of Knanaya catholic families residing in the Metropolitan Chicago and its suburban areas who feel an increasing need for the pastoral guidance by a Knanaya Catholic priest to preserve and continue our heritage and traditions among the Knanaytes here. His services will be of help to meet the spiritual and social needs of our people. We recollect that these needs have been brought to the attention of Your Excellency on a few previous occasions. We have also become aware of the inability of some of our older people here to receive and fully participate in the Holy Sacraments due to language barriers. Therefore we hereby request that a priest of our Diocese be sent to Chicago to help meet these pastoral needs of our people here."

Each petition was singed with full names of family members, their telephone number, mailing address in the USA and in India along with name of the parish in India.

The following was the forwarding letter of the petitions:


of the events that led to the filing of the enclosed petition. On December 13, 1980 twenty one members of the Kottayam Diocese who currently live in Chicago and the surrounding areas gathered together to discuss the highly needed pastoral guidance for our people here. During the gathering itself, we began the collection of a list of the members of our Diocese that now live in the area. The assembly delegated Chacko Poovathinkal. George Kappadakunnel and Rajan Kalladanthil to draft a petition to the Bishop of Kottayam requesting a priest to be assigned to this area.

On December 20, 1980 we got together again. The drafted petition was presented to the assembly for review. It was unanimously approved, both content and format. A tentative list of the Catholic Knanaytes in the area was compiled during this meeting. Four teams were formed from among the people present for the petition drive that was agreed upon by the first assembly.

We met again on January 17, 1981. The following people were present:



The petition collected by the four teams was compiled. Two hundred and five names were counted in the petition and a total of thirty six pages were accounted for in the whole compilation. Immediately the meeting moved to appoint the committee for petition filing.

It was reported that all the people who signed the petition responded to the endeavor with great enthusiasm. The assembly discussed the views expressed by them and formulated a few suggestions. One suggestion is that it might be good to consider sending one of our priests to Chicago for higher studies who could also meet our spiritual needs. We also feel that one of our priests who is already in the United States could he considered for the position. Perhaps, consideration should also be given to sending some of our older priests, in turn on extended vacations. Considering the difficulties that may be involved, we

feel that a priest with organising abilities, maturity and dependability will have the best chance in giving the project a good start. It could be possible that the priest placed here might be able to extend his services to our people in other parts of this country too. We are wondering if it might be possible to ask the Archbishop of Chicago or the Bishop of Joliet to provide temporary residence for one of our priests placed here.

If one of our priests from home is to come here fresh, it would be best for him to reach Chicago during spring or at least by the early part of summer for easier adaptation to the change of seasons here."

1981 March 18

Mar Kuriakose Kunnacherry wrote to His Eminence John Cardinal Cody, Archbishop of Chicago asking his help to make provisions for appointing a priest for the Knanaya Catholic Ministry in Chicago.

1981 April 2

Letter from the Very Rev. John R. Keating, Chancellor of the Archdiocese of Chicago to Mar Kuriakose Kunnacherry asking for the name of the priest to be sent to Chicago.

1981 May 9

Letter from Bishop Mar Kuriakose Kunnacherry proposing the name of Fr. Jacob Chollampel and requesting to appoint him as part-time associate pastor in a parish of the Archdiocese.

1982 February 16

Letter from the Chancellor Rev. John R. Keating that "it is our judgment that the creation of such a special ministry would not be appropriate at the present time."

1982 (Date unknown)

Get together of the Knanaya Catholics in Chicago on fortnight on Saturdays after the 5:30 p.m. Mass at the parish hall of St. Alphonsus Church. Whenever a Syro-Malabar priest is available Holy Mass was arranged in the basement chapel of St. Alphonsus Church.

1982 November 3

Bishop Mar Kuriakose Kunnacherry's letter to the then new Archbishop of Chicago Most Rev. Joseph L. Bernardin to reconsider the request for starting the new ministry.

1983 September 7

Rev. Richard J. Feller, the pastor of Church of St. Ita wrote to the Chancellor of the Archdiocese of Chicago expressing his willingness to provide residence for Fr. Jacob Chollampel in his parish.

1983 September 27

Rev. John C. Hergenrother, Chancellor of the Archdiocese of Chicago held a meeting with two representatives each from four associations: (1) Kerala Catholic Fellowship, (2) Knanaya Association of North America, (3) Knanaya Catholic Congress, and (4) Knanaya Association of Chicago. Agreement was reached to avail the service of Fr. Jacob Chollampel to serve all Kerala Catholics in Chicago.

1983 October 7

Rev. John C. Hergenrother, the Chancellor of the Archdiocese of Chicago wrote to Mar Kuriakose Kunnacherry welcoming the service of Fr. Jacob Chollampel.

1983 October 28

Fr. Jacob Chollampel reached Chicago and started his special ministry to the Kerala Catholics while living in Church of St. Ita.

1984 October

Non-Knanaya Catholics and Syro-Malabarians started writing to Kerala Catholic Bishop's Conference and Syro-Malabar Bishop's Conference asking for separate ministry for Non-Knanaya Catholics in Chicago.

1984 December 3 and 4

The Syro-Malabar Bishop's Conference authorized His Excellency Mar Joseph Pallikaparambil to correspond with the Archbishop of Chicago "to get a priest for the Syro-Malabar Rite appointed for the special minis-

try to the non-Knanaya Syro-Malabarians in Chicago in addition to Rev. Fr. Jacob Chollampel who is already appointed for the ministry to the Knanaya Community."

1985 April 15

Mar Kuriakose Kunnacherry wrote to Joseph Cardinal Bernardin proposing to send Rev. Fr. Cyriac Manthuruthil to continue the special ministry of Knanaya Catholics in Chicago in the place of Rev. Fr. Jacob Chollampel who is asked to return to Kottayam.

1985 August 31

Rev. Robert L. Kealy, chancellor of the Archdiocese of Chicago wrote to Mar Kuriakose Kunnacherry that clarification is to be made on membership issue of Knanaya Ministry before Fr. Cyriac Manthuruthy could come and take over the ministry.

1985 September - December

Fr. Jacob Chollampel returned to India and the community kept waiting for the arrival of Fr. Cyriac Manthuruthil.

1985 December 3

Fr. Anthony Kurialacherry, Spiritual Director of Syro-Malabar Catholic Community of Chicago has agreed at the request of the Knanaya Community members to continue with the Syro-Malabar Mass at St. Benedict's Church, Chicago on every Saturday evening. Fr. C.T. Vayalil from the Archdiocese of Changanacherry who serves as a chaplain in a hospital in Chicago also agreed to help with the ministry.

1987 January 23

Letter from Rev. Robert L. Kealy assigns Fr. Zacharias Elapunkal, the director of the Syro-Malabar Ministry to coordinate the services of all the Syro-Malabar priests who might celebrate the liturgy for the Knanaya Syro-Malabar Ministry.

1987 December 7

Cardinal Joseph Bernardin wrote to Mar Kuriakose Kunnacherry expressing his willingness to accept the service of Fr. Cyriac Manthuruthil for the Knanaya Syro-Malabar Ministry in Chicago.

1988 May 24

Fr. Cyriac Manthuruthil left India to Chicago to serve the Knanaya Syro-Malabar Ministry.

1988 May 31

Archdiocese of Chicago appointed Fr. Cyriac Manthuruthil as director of Knanaya Catholic Mission while residing as St. Ferdinand's Church in Chicago.

1988 July 23

Inauguration of a new "Knanaya Catholic Mission" at St. Henry's at 6:30 P.M. Mass is offered at St. Henry's Church every other Saturday night at 6:30 P.M. Chancellor Rev. Robert L. Kealy delivered a message during the mass.

1989 April 15

Final liturgy of the Knanaya Catholic Mission at St. Henry's Church and the beginning of the liturgy at IHM Church.

1991 October 26

Agreement signed for the use of Immaculate Heart of Mary Church by Rev. Fr. Norbert Zawistanowicz, pastor of IHM Church and Rev. Fr. Cyriac Manthuruthil, Knanaya Mission Director.

1995 August 16

Archdiocese of Chicago appointed Fr. Simon Edathiparambil as the director of Knanaya Catholic Mission replacing Fr. Cyriac Manthuruthil. The residence of Fr. Edathiparambil is at Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish.

1995 December 30

Agreement renewed between Rev. James F. Blazek, pastor of IHM church and Mission Director Rev. Fr. Simon Edathiparambil for the use of Immaculate Heart of Mary Church for the Knanaya Community.

1999 June 25

Archdiocese of Chicago appointed Fr. Philip Thodukayil as the director of Knanaya Catholic Mission with his residence at Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish.

2000 February 5

Fr. Philip Thodukayil started Saturday evening mass at 6:00 P.M. on every first Saturdays of the month at St. Isidore's Church in Bloomingdale.

2001 January 14

Fr. Philip Thodukayil started Sunday morning mass at 10:00 A.M. at KCS Community Center followed by Religious Education Classes at the center.

2001 July 1

Inauguration of St. Thomas Syro-Malabar Catholic Diocese of Chicago and consecration of its bishop Mar Jacob Angadiath at Hyatt Hotel in Chicago.

2002 February 16

Fr. Philip Thodukayil started Saturday evening mass at 6:00 P.M. on every third Saturdays of the month at our Lady of Mount Carmel Church in Darien.

2003 October 29

Mar Jacob Angadiath officially recognized the Knanaya Catholic Mission of Chicago, along with nine other Knanaya Catholic Missions in the USA as a mission of the St. Thomas Diocese of Chicago. He also confirmed the appointment of Rev. Fr. Philip Thodukayil as the director of this mission. According to Mar Jacob Angadiath, "The Knanaya Catholic Mission of Chicago will consist of all the Knanaya Catholics living in the states of Illinois, Indiana and Wisconsin."

2004 July 1

Mar Jacob Angadiath relieved Rev. Fr. Philip Thodukayil from his service as director of Knanaya Catholic Mission of Chicago and appointed Fr. Abraham Mutholath, the vicar general, also as the director of the mission.

2004 July 1

Fr. Abraham Mutholath selected

2004 August 7

Last Mass at St. Isidore's Church in Bloomingdale.

2004 August 8

First Solemn Feast Celebration of the mission at IHM Church in honor of Pope St. Pius X. Bishop Mar Kuriakose Kunnacherry sent a particle of the scull cap worn by St. Pius X and personally gifted to Bishop Mar Mathew Makil as relics. Bishop Mar Mathew Moolakkatt was the main celebrant. Peter and Salykutty Kulanagara were the sponsors (prasudenties).

2004 August 21

Last Mass at our Lady of Mount Carmel Church in Darien.

2004 September 4

Mass started at St. Peter's Church in North Lake on every Saturday at 5:00 P.M. followed by novena of Our Lady of Perpetual Help.

2004 September 11

Starting of Religious Education School at North Lake. Classes are held from 3:45 P.M. to 4:45 P.M. every Saturday.

2004 September 12

Starting of Religious Education School at IHM School. Classes are held from 4:00 P.M. to 5:00 P.M. every Sunday.

2004 December 3 - 5

First Pre-marriage Course offered by Knanaya Catholic Mission.

2005 March 5

First Religious Education Festival at Thaft High School.

2005 May 12 - 15

Feast of St. Michael sponsored by parishioners from Neendoor residing in Chicago area. Co-adjutor Bishop of the Archeparchy of Kottayam Mar Mathew Moolakkatt was the main celebrant.

2005 May 22

His Excellency Mar Mathew Moolakkatt requested the Knanaya Catholics in Chicago to establish our own church during his homily at IHM Church. The planning to have our own church started with this.

2005 May 31

Agreement signed by Rev. Thomas H. Cargo, pastor of St. Joseph Church in Addison and Mission Director Rev. Abraham Mutholath for the use of St. Joseph School for Religious Education and hall for Mass on Saturdays with effect from June 18, 2005.

2005 June 18

Mass for Chicago Suburb is moved from St. Peter's Church in North Lake to the hall of St. Joseph's Church in Addison. Fr. Abraham Mutholath celebrated the first mass here for the mission.

2005 July 1

Saji Pootrhukayil, Sunny Thekkepparambil, James Manjankal, and Baby Karikkal took charge as kaikkararans (trustees) of the mission.

2005 August 18 - 21

Solemn Feast Celebration of St. Stephen sponsored by Mathew and Alphonsa Poothura and family at Community Center, Thaft High School, and IHM Church.

2005 September 23

Mission started beginning of twoyear Theology Course for lay people to learn more on the Church, Bible, and Spirituality. This helped for church awareness and development of dedicated volunteers.

2005 September 24

First Sal Solo Devotional Music Program for Knanaya youngsters held at OLV gymnasium.

2005 October 2

Started publishing Sunday Bulletin for the mission in the website and printed copies in the churches during weekend Masses.

2005 December 4

Celebrated the Sacerdotal Silver Jubilee of our Mission Director Rev. Fr. Abraham Mutholath at OLV Church. Bishop Mar Jacob Angadiath was the chief guest.

2006 February 11

Starting of Legion of Mary unit in the mission.

2006 March 4

Religious Education Festival at Thaft High School. First presentation of Knanaya Kudiyetta Ballet with original songs published by the mission.

2006 March 18

Beginning of Senior Citizen's Ministry in the mission.

2006 April 18

First Meeting of Better Family Movement of the Knanaya Catholic Mission.

2006 April 28

Bishop Mar Jacob Angadiath established seven regions in St. Thomas Syro-Malabar Diocese of Chicago. One of these regions is for all Knanaya Catholics in the diocese. "The formal Knanaya Catholic missions and the faithful of the Knanaya community living in other places where no formal missions are established will make one region." Vicar General Rev. Fr. Abraham Mutholath is appointed as the director of this region.

2006 April 30

Mar Jacob Angadiath officially declared the establishment of Knanaya Catholic Region at OLV Church Chicago and appointed Vicar General Rev. Fr. Abraham Mutholath as Region Director.

2006 May 25 - 28

First Solemn feast celebration of Most Sacred Heart of Jesus at Community Center, OLV Church, Thaft High School Auditorium, and St. Joseph's Church Addison. Archbishop Emeritus Mar Kuriakose Kunnacherry and Bishop Mar Jacob Angadiath were main celebrants.

2006 May 25



Mar Jacob Angadiath announced that the patron saint of the proposed new church would be the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus and the name of the parish would be "Sacred Heart Knanaya Catholic Parish."

2006 June 24

Fr. Abraham Mutholath revealed the location of the church to be bought during the Music Concert by Rev. Fr. Paul Poovathumkal at Thaft High School Auditorium.

2006 July 1

Matchan Chemmachel took charge as program coordinator and Roy Kannothara, Joy Nediyakalayil, Jose Pinarkayil, and Alex Kannachamparambil took charge as trustees (Kaikkarans) of the mission.

2006 July 9

Started full pages multicolor printing of the Parish Bulletin.

2006 July 15

Originally planned date of inaugurating former St. James Church in Maywood as Sacred Heart Knanaya Catholic Church for Knanaya Catholics in Chicago. Instead, a concelebrated Mass was offered at Addison School Hall by Archbishop Mar Kuriakose Kunnachererry, Archbishop Mar Mathew Moolakkatt, and Bishop Mar Jacob Angadiath.

2006 July 16

Originally planned Parish Inauguration Banquet at Crown Jewel Banquet Hall in Des Plaines. During this banquet, Bishop Mar Jacob Angadiath announced his decision to purchase St. James Church in Maywood for Knanaya Catholic Mission. The decision to purchase the church was suspended because of the objection from many members of the community. At the request of the bishop, more than 400 families signed in favor of purchasing the church.

2006 September 1, Friday

First Mass at St. James Church in Maywood for Knanaya Catholic Mission at 7:00 P.M..

2006 September 2, Saturday

First administration of the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Chrismation, and Holy Communion) at St. James Church in May for Knanaya Catholic Mission.

2006 September 3, Sunday

Inauguration of Sacred Heart Knanaya Catholic Church in Maywood at 10:00 A.M. by Vicar General Rev. Fr. Abraham Mutholath and parish council members.

2006 September 14 - 16

Pilgrimage to the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico by 51 parishioners to ask for the intercession of Our Blessed Mother for our church and to purchase statue of Our Lady of Guadalupe from there and get it blessed in the Basilica.

2006 September 22

Purchase of Church property from the Archdiocese of Chicago.

2006 September 24

Blessing of new interior architectural work of Sacred Heart Knanaya Catholic Church and declaration of Knanaya Catholic Mission as Sacred Heart Knanaya Catholic Parish and appointment of Mission Director Rev. Fr. Abraham Mutholath as pastor or vicar of the parish by His Excellency Mar Jacob Angadiath. Installation of the statue of Our Lady of Guadalupe in the Church by Mar Jacob Angadiath. His Excellency Bishop Thomas Paprocki inaugurated the meeting and City Mayor of Maywood was another chief guest.

2006 October 1

Starting or prayer group in our parish. The group meets every Sunday after Holy Mass.

2006 October 20

Starting Holy Mass on Friday evenings at 7:00 and Saturday mornings at 10:00. Adoration is held on every First Friday's of the month after Holy Mass. Novena of Our Lady of Perpetual Help is held every Saturday after the Holy Mass.

2006 October 29

Inauguration of Religious Stall of the parish by Bishop Mar Jacob Angadiath.

2006 November 10

Starting of novena to St. Michael once month in our church.

2006 December 8

First Feast celebration of Our Lady of Guadalupe in our parish church.

2006 December 25

Vicar Fr. Abraham Mutholath sent a circular announcing the formation of St. Mary's Unit for those Knanaya Catholics who attend OLV church for their pastoral needs with effect from January 1, 2007.

2006 December 26 - 29

First Youth Retreat of the Parish at Bishop Lane Retreat Center in Rockford. It was an "amazing experience" for the participants and they began to involve actively in the parish.

2007 January 14

Starting of separate English Mass in the Syro-Malabar rite for youngsters at Maywood Church.

2007 March 10

Combined Religious Education Festival of Sacred Heart and St. Mary's Religious Education Schools at Thaft High School auditorium. Bishop Mar Jacob Angadiath was the chief guest.

2007 April 22

First Meeting of St. Vincent de Paul Society in our parish.

2007 April 27

Fundraising drama "Velicham Tharatha Deepangal" organized by Women Ministry for the building fund of Youth Center.

2007 April 29

First Meeting of Senior Citizens' Ministry at Sacred Heart Knanaya Catholic Church.

First Holy Communion and Chrismation of St. Mary's Unit at St. John's Church in Niles.



2007 May 6

First Holy Communion and Chrismation of Sacred Heart Religious Education Schools at the parish church.

2007 May 31

Purchase of Rectory from the Archdiocese of Chicago.

2007 June 1

Dedication of Knanaya Catholic Parish Cemetery at Queen of Heaven Cemetery by Bishops Mar Jacob Angadiath, Bishop of Miao Mar George Pallipparambil, and Most Rev. Dr. Thomas Paprocki, Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Chicago.

2007 June 1 - 3

Solemn Feast Celebration of Little Flower at our parish church in Maywood sponsored by Nediyakalayil family. Bishops Mar Jacob Angadiath and Bishop of Miao Mar George Pallipparambil were main celebrants.

2007 June 3

Our parish became the sponsor of the Catholic Diocese of Miao in the state of Arunachal Pradesh in India. The pastor Fr. Abraham Mutholath handed over two checks of 10,001 each for the construction of Sacred Heart Church and Sts. Peter and Paul Church in the Diocese of Maio to Mar George Pallipparambil. The fund for Sacred Heart Church was raised from a second collection today and the fund for Sts. Peter and Paul Church is personal contribution of our Vicar Rev. Fr. Abraham Mutholath.

2007 June 6

The first burial in the Knanaya Catholic Cemetery. Mr. Lukose Koduvathara who died on June 2nd was buried here today.

2007 June 7

The first funeral service in our parish church. Mr. Abraham Pinarkayil who died on June 4th had his funeral service in this church and was buried in Mary Hill Cemetery.

2007 July 1

Kannachamparambil Alex took

charge as program coordinator and Aikkarapparambil Thomas, Chemmachel Mathachan, Karickal Baby, Varakalayil Joy, Vettathukandathil Sunil (St. Mary's Unit) took charge as the trustees (kaikkarans) of the parish.

2007 July 2

Cardinal Varkey Vithayayil, Major Archbishop of the Syro-Malabar Catholic Church visited our parish and offered Holy Mass along with Bishop Mar Jacob Angadiath. Cardinal blessed the foundation stone for the proposed Youth Center of our parish.

2007 July 4 - 7

Second Youth Retreat of the parish at Bishop Lane Retreat Center in Rockford. Bishop Mar Jacob Angadiath also was present for this retreat to guide our youth.

2007 September 20 - 23

Retreat by Bro. Benny Punnathura and other members of Shalom TV Team.

2007 September 28

First Meeting of Knanaya Region held in our parish. Bishop Mar Jacob Angadiath, Vicar General and Region Director Rev. Fr. Abraham Mutholath, Priests and lay representatives from Knanaya Missions in the U.S. participated in it.

2007 October 7

First visit of Archbishop Mar Mathew Moolakkatt in our church.

2007 October 31

Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of Chicago terminated their Early Childhood Development Program at Sacred Heart Church school building.

2007 November 18

Inauguration of the Silver Jubilee Year of Knanaya Catholic Mission of Chicago by lighting 24 candles at Sacred Heart Knanaya Catholic Church by Vicar Fr. Abraham Mutholath and parish council members.

2008 January 11

Parish Pilgrimage to the Diocese of Miao for the inauguration of Sacred

Heart Church in Miao sponsored by our parish and SS. Peter and Paul Church in Miao sponsored by our vicar Fr. Abraham Mutholath.

2008 January 19

Rev. Fr. Abraham Mutholath blessed Sacred Heart Church in the Diocese of Miao sponsored by Sacred Heart Knanaya Catholic Parish in Chicago. Thirty members from Chicago Knanaya Catholic Parish participated in the function.

2008 January 20






not there before. Each of our spiritual life has also become a stronger and now we have become closer to Christ. Our relationships with adults and other parishoners have also increased.

I can tell you with confidence that our presence in Maywood, albert short, already had profound impact in the local community. Let me illustrate my point with an example.






In the 27 years I have lived in Chicago, I have seen our community go through good times and bad times. Therefore, I was cautiously optimistic when we bought the Church in Maywood nearly a year ago. Today, as I witness the growth of our vibrant Church community, I can only salute the people who took the initiative to buy this Church for our community.

What I see at the Maywood Church facility is joy, happiness, and above all peace. The Church is always overfilled with worshippers who genuinely come there to pray, just as Jesus would have wanted them to do in His Father's house. The Church, the hallways, and the classrooms are clean without any odor of cigarette smoke or alcohol. As a matter of fact anyone can walk through the halls of the Church without the fear of stumbling into a room where a bunch of men are drinking or playing cards. It is unfortunate that a small group in our community projects such a negative image. For some, alcohol and happiness are synonymous but for many of us it is a disgrace to the Knanaya name.

People who do not come to few more like the Church have no idea what they are missing. Some say they are afraid of the Maywood churches estably neighborhood, some use the few more like the Knanaya Commu America. truth is that many are afraid of their own family members and friends. As for me, I am proud of this church and what it has done to touch many members of our community.

A couple of years ago when Archbishop Mathew Moolakatt visited Chicago, I asked him how we can establish a Knanava diocese in America. He replied "Without having Churches, how can we have a diocese? Under the current circumstances in America we should buy Churches". Now that we have Maywood church, I only wish that we could have a few more like this one in our Knanaya Community in North America. Religious Education Program:

A mile stone in the History of Knanaya Catholics of Chicago

Over the 25 years of its existence, the Knanaya Catholic Mission of Chicago, under the leadership of great priests has been a major factor in the overall growth of the Knanaya Catholic Community of Chicago land. The immense growth and the accomplishments of our mission during the last four years period deserve special mention. Elevation of the Knanaya Catholic Mission to the Sacred Heart Knanaya Catholic Parish and the acquisition of the Sacred Heart Knanaya Church are the major achievements of this period. Our people have grown spiritually to a greater extent, and many are making remarkable contribution to the development of their parish. Thanks to Fr. Abraham Mutholath for his efficient leadership and for his determined effort with which we have accomplished so much. It is through the expansion of our Religious Education program that our people began to realize the need for a church of our own, and this change of attitude was the major key to all our success and accomplishments.

History and Background

Although the Knanaya Catholic Mission of Chicago has existed for more than 25 years, it was only in the year 2000 it was able to start its own Religious Education Program. In the year 2000 Fr. Philip Thodukayil, the then Director of the Mission, took initiative to open a Religious Education School of our own. It indeed was a major accomplishment, and also it marked a major turning point in the history of the Knanaya Catholic Mission of Chicago. The school was operated at the Knanaya Catholic Community Center, and the classes were officially begun in September of that year. Classes were organized and taught by Fr.Philip with the help of a group of high school and college going youth from our community on Sundays following the Holy Mass at 10 am. The school year ended in May with a common celebration of the Fist

Communion, a tradition set forth by Fr.Simon Edathiparambil a decade ago. This system continued in the following years, and it was beneficial to many families who had easy access to the community center.

Expansion and Restructuring

In July 2004 when Fr. Abrham Mutholath became the Director of the Knanaya Catholic Mission, he proposed the idea of expanding and reorganizing our Religious Education Program so that it would be beneficial to all Knanaya Catholic children in the Chicago land. With this idea, after consulting with the Trustees of the Mission, Fr. Mutholath decided to operate our Religious Education Program at two locations; on Sundays at IHM School in Chicago at 4pm followed by Holy Mass at IHM Church, and on Saturdays at 3.45 pm at St. Mary's church, North Lake followed by Holy Mass. The school year extended from the 2nd weekend of September 2004 to the 3rd weekend of May 2005. In that school year 130 children attended IHM School and 75 children attended North Lake School, Training and the orientation for the Religious Education Teachers were provided by the Religious Education Faculty at the Marthoma Sleeha Syro-Malabar Parish.

In September 2005 the Schools were relocated to OLV School in Chicago and St.Joseph's School in Addison, with the same class schedule from the previous school year. In 2005-06 School year there was a considerable increase in the number of registrations. In that School year 200 children attended OLV School and 120 children attended St.Joseph's School. The 2005-06 school year ended on the 3rd weekend of May 2006.

In September 2006 after the acquisition of the Sacred Heart Knanaya Church in Maywood, it became our parish church and

the center for the Religious Education Schools. Considering the convenience of many families from north suburbs, the Parish decided to continue the Religious Education School at OLV church. The schools were named Sacred Heart School and St.Mary's School respectively. In school year 2006-07 230 children attended Sacred Heart School and 130 children attended St.Mary's School. The school year extended from the 2nd Sunday of September 2006 to the 2nd Sunday of May 2007. At St.Mary's School the class schedule remained the same from the previous year. At Sacred Heart School the classes were held on Sunday mornings immediately after the Holy Mass at 10am. There was a considerable increase in the number of students attending the schools during the school year 2007-08. At present there are 375 students attending Sacred Heart School, and 150 students attending St. Mary's School. Since the beginning of 2007-08 school year, the classes at Sacred Heart School begins at 10am on school days, followed by Holy Qurbana in English for the youth and children at 11.30am.

Curriculum

The curriculum for our Religious Education Program is designed not only to focus on the faith formation of our children but also to give them knowledge about the knanaya community. It is required that the children attend Holy Mass before or after their classes. In addition to the regular class room activities, children participate in monthly spiritual programs organized by the various ministries. For convenience they are divided into children, teen and youth minis-



tries based on their age. Once or twice a year the children along with their young teachers will be given classes based on the history and traditions of the Knanaya Community.

Religious Education Festival

A highly appreciated program of the school is the annual Religious Education Festival, which is a 3-4 hour performance including dances and skits with themes based on the Bible and the Knanaya Culture by the children and the young teachers. It is part of the school's curriculum. Knanaya Kudiyetta Ballet, a dance performance based on the historical origin and formation of the Knanaya community caught the attention of many, a theme proposed by Fr.Mutholath. The songs of for ballet are taken from the album Knanaya Kudiyetta Ganangal. These songs, written and composed by Fr.Martin Varikkanickal, give great insight into the evangelical origin and formation of the Knanaya Community and their contribution to Christianity in India, a truth often ignored by many. Thanks to Mrs. Mary Thomas Alumkal for assisting

Fr.Martin with the production of the album and directing the Ballet.

Faculty

The faculty consists of DREs, Asst.DREs, Secretaries, and Coordinators of children, teen and youth ministries and the Catechists, functioning under Parish Vicar, Fr.Abraham Mutholath. These are a group of very dedicated individuals who with their great service brought us success. The main feature of our Religious Education Program is that 95% of our catechists are high school and college going youth. Not only the children love them but also they feel at home in their presence. It is great to see them participating in various activities of the church in addition to teaching, and staying in the mainstream of the community.

Over the years we have been fortunate to receive extremely valuable service from Tony Pullappallil, Tomy Kunnasseril and Saji Poothrukkayil as DREs, Brenda Edukkutharayil,Tissy Njaravelil, Josmy Edukkutharyil and Maneesh Kaimoolayil as Asst. DREs, Femia Puthenpuravil, Tesa

Thannikkari, Ann Kulangara, Veena Kaniayali, Gipty Chakkalathottiyil, Abeena Karickal, Neethu Kurppanparambil, and Rose Ann Pathiyil as Secretaries, and Mrs. Mary Thomas Alumkal, Mrs.Saly Francis Kizhakkekuttu and Mrs.Josmy Edukkutharyil as Religious Education Festival coordinators. These individuals, along with the coordinators of various ministries and the catechists, work as a great team under our Parish Vicar Fr. Abraham Mutholath doing great service to our Parish and to our Community. I thank the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus for being a part of such a team of great individuals, and I am grateful to Fr.Mutholath for giving me that opportunity. We extend our sincere gratitude to H.E. Bishop Mar Jacob Angadiath for all his blessings and encouragements over the years. We also extend our sincere thanks to Archbishop Mar Kuriakose Kunnacherry, and Archbishop Mar Mathew Moolakkat for visiting our schools, and for giving valuable directives.
